Course Objectives (Old Testament Focus)

- 1. **Identify and Define Key Attributes of God Revealed in the Old Testament:** Students will be able to recognize and clearly articulate core attributes of God (e.g., holiness, justice, mercy, faithfulness, sovereignty, etc.) as revealed in key Old Testament passages.
- 2. **Trace the Consistency of God's Character Across the Old Testament Narrative:**Students will be able to connect how God's attributes are consistently demonstrated from Genesis through the Prophets, even in different genres (law, history, poetry, prophecy).
- 3. **Interpret Scripture Through a Theological Lens Focused on God's Nature:** Students will be equipped to read and interpret Old Testament texts not just for historical or moral insight, but with a theological lens that highlights what the passage reveals about God's character.
- 4. Distinguish Between Popular Misconceptions of God and the Biblical Revelation of His Character: Students will be able to compare and contrast cultural or emotional assumptions about who God is with the authoritative biblical witness of who God reveals Himself to be.
- 5. **Develop a Personal and Practical Theology Rooted in God's Self-Revelation:**Students will reflect on how a deeper understanding of God's attributes affects their daily lives, worship, relationships, and personal identity, forming the foundation for a biblically grounded theology.

December 2, 2025: God is a God Who Promises a New Way

- Focus: Minor Prophets Hosea to Malachi

 - Hosea 2 (God's judgment and promise to allure and restore)
 - Hosea 3 (Redemption and covenant love)

 - o Hosea 11 (God's fatherly compassion despite Israel's rebellion)
 - Joel 1 (A locust plague as a wake-up call)
 - o Joel 2 (Call to repentance + promise of restoration and outpouring of the Spirit)
 - o Joel 3 (God judges the nations and restores His people)
 - o Amos 1–2 (Judgment on surrounding nations including Israel and Judah)
 - Amos 5 (Seek justice and righteousness "let justice roll down like waters")
 - Amos 7 (Amos' visions and intercession)
 - Obadiah 1 (Judgment on Edom and the Day of the Lord)
 - Jonah 1 (Jonah flees God's call)
 - o Jonah 2 (Jonah's prayer from the belly of the fish)
 - Jonah 3 (Nineveh repents)
 - Jonah 4 (God teaches Jonah about compassion)
 - Micah 4 (Hope for peace and a future kingdom)
 - Micah 5 (Prophecy of a ruler from Bethlehem)
 - Micah 6 (God's case against Israel "What does the Lord require of you?")
 - Micah 7 (God's mercy and steadfast love)
- Objective: Hear God's consistent call to return and His promise of renewal.

December 16, 2025: God is a God Who Prepares the Way

- Focus: Minor Prophets + Intertestamental Period
- Scripture: TBA

 - Nahum 1 (God's justice and power against Nineveh)
 - Nahum 3 (Woe to the bloody city fall of Nineveh)
 - Habakkuk 1 (Habakkuk questions God's justice)
 - Habakkuk 2 (God's response "the righteous shall live by faith")
 - Habakkuk 3 (A prayer of trust and praise)
 - Zephaniah 1 (Coming judgment on Judah)
 - Zephaniah 3 (Restoration and rejoicing over God's people)

- o Haggai 1 (Rebuke for neglecting the temple)
- Haggai 2 (Encouragement to rebuild future glory is greater)
- Zechariah 1 (Call to return to the Lord + night visions)
- Zechariah 3 (Joshua the high priest cleansed)
- Zechariah 8 (Promise of restoration and peace)
- Zechariah 9 (Prophecy of a humble king riding on a donkey)
- o Zechariah 14 (The Lord reigns future Day of the Lord)
